

Maths - Number

- Saying number names in order, forwards and backwards
- Compare groups using 'more' and 'fewer'.
- Counting out small numbers of objects.
- Finding one more and one less than a number to 10
- Recognising numbers to 20.
- Ordering numbers to 10
- Adding and subtracting small numbers

Maths - Shape, space and measure

- Compare and order animals
- Make and describe patterns, match patterns to animals.
- Order activities/times of the day

Physical Development

Moving in a variety of ways exploring keeping active. Using a variety of tools with good control including pencils for writing. Exploring a variety of ways to keep ourselves safe, including when we use tools and walk around the local area. Exploring a variety of equipment outside and identifying different ways of moving in, on, over and through them.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be building our confidence to try new activities. We will be learning to work in small groups to encourage teamwork. We will be reading stories and discussing how characters feel.

Understanding the World

Learning about similarities and differences in animals. Exploring how different animals change as they grow. Understanding how different people live around the world and how it is the same or different from us. Thinking about celebrations including Harvest Festival, Diwali, Remembrance Day and Christmas. Learning to use a simple ICT program and take photographs. Using a range of software to create different African patterns and animal prints.

Expressive Arts and Design

Exploring music and instruments from Africa and creating our own rhythms. Constructing objects to help and look after animals, and making animals using a variety of resources. We will be exploring different ways to join those materials together. Using our learning environment to role play key stories and experiences. Exploring techniques including collaging and weaving. Creating our own dances showing how we move and animals move.

Literacy

Exploring mark making with different tools in a range of media. Beginning to learn how to read words by blending sounds together. Using adjectives to describe different African animals. Using fact books and films to gather information. Writing captions using prepositions (e.g. on, over, in. Sequence stories and label pictures. Write lists and letters for Christmas. Using 'because' to explain our thoughts.

To use our senses to explore our local surroundings and learn how to keep safe. Listen and follow 3 part instructions and give directions to others. Explore nature by collecting and constructing different objects we have found.
